
Dispatches from Downunder



December 2023 edition

Greetings for the end of 2023 – I guess we are all looking forward to Christmas and the start of a new year with or without our best resolutions. The year of 2023 has been an especially momentous year for AUSMD and Mayflower in Australia. We had the first visit of the Governor General to Mayflower's newest Society, when Jane Hurt spent close to a week in Qld for the AGM and associated activities in mid July 2023. It also allowed us to negotiate the use of the rather grand Queensland Parliament House in central Brisbane which dates from 1867, for our meetings and social venues.

In September, as DDG, I represented AUSMD at a face-to-face Congress (2020 Congress turned out to be a series of long Zoom meetings) the first time an Australian attended the Congress in Plymouth. AUSMD was awarded the Greene Bowl for the



greatest percentage growth of any of the 54 societies for the last two years. The Society was also honoured by the appointment of Past Governor, Keith Quimbach to the Juniors GSMD Committee and Governor, Bill Elliott's appointment to the GSMD Marketing and Promotion Committee.

Our Deputy Governor, Philip Koether, has been recovering from major surgery, in October, but we are hoping to have him back at least in a limited format in the New Year. Best wishes from all your friends in AUSMD, Philip!

Treasurer David Magee has taken the lead in our move from using Zoom to the Adoption of Office 365 and Teams. Microsoft is making Office 365 available to qualified Not-for -Profit companies, and AUSMD is one of those qualified organisations. As well as a range of software, we will have free cloud storage and most importantly free use of Teams instead of paying over \$30 per month for Zoom. This is a great initiative.

Connie, as Secretary, has a wide range of activities and responsibilities with help in preparing the meeting minutes from Pat Magee. She is always energetically ensuring our record keeping is impeccable as well as leading the Publicity Committee.

We provide our membership details to Plymouth based on numbers at the end of December, and with a few weeks to go we now appear to have 62 members of AUSMD which is a great growth since the 20 that were required to initiate the society in 2020. We will have our fourth anniversary in 2024 - the formation of the society was approved by the GSMD from 26 January 2020, and we were registered as a not-for-profit corporation and the Constitution adopted on 2 June 2020.

Quintessential American Ancestor by Steve Isham Rebecca Isham 1731-1823

Like an upper floor in some old Colonial inn the doors to Isham family lives in ten generations align on a long corridor with oak timbered tread.



Timothy's door is third from the end Inscribed - April 25 1751 - in Puritan Copperplate to indicate the day of his marriage to Rebecca Fuller who sits inside rocking in a bent wood chair reciting the birthdays of her 16 children including Timothy captured in the Battle of Long Island in 1776 and Joshua whose burned-down Connecticut house was rebuilt by neighbors the following Saturday.


Rebecca goes to glory at 92. Rebecca the great great granddaughter of Samuel Fuller who at 12 years old survived the two month stormy crossing in the Mayflower and the following year broke bread with the Wampanoags at the first Thanksgiving.

Renowned illustrator, P. J. Lynch begins the story of John Howland, the teenaged servant of John Carver, as he leaves London and sails on the Mayflower. John Howland describes how he miraculously survived falling overboard and went on to help in the building of the new colony in Plymouth, then took part in the Thanksgiving harvest feast. The exquisite illustrations truly bring the story to life and John speaks with the questioning voice of a teen in a new world.
